Questions and Answers:

- 1) Is a bid bond required for this project at the time of bid?
Yes
- 2) Proposal attendees that turn proposals in will be read aloud, no pricing correct?
Correct
- 3) I see you included a Bid Schedule with all the line items broken down. Does this need to be turned in or will you be supplying an actual cost proposal form like you sometimes do?
The units on the bid schedule are provided for reference and should be considered approximate. The project will be awarded on a lump sum basis. The contractor is responsible for verifying quantities in the field. The cost proposal should be submitted separately in a sealed envelope. The city is not requiring a specific format for the cost proposal.
- 4) Is the Rosgen Certification a requirement to bid/construct this project?
The City will assess the proposals by the following criteria: Experience and Qualifications -60%, Rosgen Certification – 5%, Cost – 35%. The Rosgen Certification will not be required.
- 5) We have performed numerous stream restoration and gabion wall projects but we do not have a Rosgen Certification on staff. In section 3.1.6 it is listed as a requirement. Is that a necessity to bid this project or would our references, experience and other certifications be assessed in-lieu of the Rosgen Certification.
The city will assess all qualifications, please see response to question 5.
- 6) Section 5.1 thru 5.5 – just for clarity – Is the City wanting us to maintain a construction trailer on the project with power, printers etc?
The City does not want a construction trailer onsite. Only equipment needed to complete the construction project should be maintained onsite.

- 7) Section 5.6 – will we be allowed to park our company trucks in the roadway or will we be required to maintain a gravel parking area?

Trucks can be parked in the roadway where required. All efforts should be made to minimize traffic impacts.

- 8) I have asked several of our vendors about the gabion baskets being Aluminized wire.....they only have PVC coated and galvanized. Would one of these be acceptable?

The City prefers that the gabion baskets be **both** PVC coated and galvanized. If this is not regionally available, preference will be given to PVC coated baskets.
