



Rules/Regulations for Temporary Signage

New!

Per new regulations adopted by Dunwoody's Mayor and City Council on August 24, 2020, temporary signs (with a permit) are now allowed in the Dunwoody Village Overlay.

Lots with less than four units are allowed one temporary sign; lots with four or more units are allowed two temporary signs.

1. All signs over 16 square feet require a permit from the City of Dunwoody.
2. Temporary signs shall not exceed 24 square feet.
3. Each temporary sign must be individually attached to poles, mast arms, fences, building facade or other similar structures.
4. No more than two temporary signs shall be displayed on any lot at one time.
5. All temporary signs must be maintained in good condition as provided for flags in section 20-66.
6. No temporary signs shall be displayed for more than 14 consecutive days, with no more than six such 14-day periods being permitted per calendar year per lot.
7. Pole banners are regulated by section 26-279 and are not subject to the standards of this chapter.
8. Standard informational signs are signs that are 9 square feet or less of sign area and a maximum combined sign area of 18 square feet per lot. During a political cycle (between the date of qualification and final determination), there are no maximums for combined sign area for standard informational signs.

The City of Dunwoody's Code Enforcement conducts sign sweeps periodically in order to determine compliance with temporary signs. Fines for signs out of compliance can be up to \$1,000. If the sign is not brought into compliance with Dunwoody regulations, a citation may be given. If you see a sign out of compliance, email compliance@dunwoodyga.gov
