



# Dine-in eating temporarily closed at Dunwoody restaurants

**Ordinance will remain in effect for 30 days but can be lifted at any time**

**Restrictions are advised immediately; enforcement begins Friday, March 20 at 9 p.m.**

In an effort to reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19 for employees and the public, Dunwoody bars and restaurants will be temporarily allowed to offer delivery and takeout only. The emergency ordinance was approved by the Dunwoody City Council on March 18.

The emergency ordinance requires bars, restaurants, or businesses that sell food or beverages for consumption on premises to close in-person dining. Those establishments are allowed to offer delivery, take-out, drive-thru and curbside service.

Establishments that are authorized to sell beer and wine on premises will be allowed to sell unopened beer and wine for takeout while this emergency ordinance is in effect. While providing takeout, establishments are required to limit access and provide enough room so that customers and staff can keep a safe distance.
