

- Two Bridges Park construction continues with Q1 2023 scheduled completion date. The playground installation and parking lot paving is complete. The splash pad and bathroom construction ongoing through December.
- The delivery of CXT bathroom for Waterford Park is scheduled for January 2023.

#### **Finished Projects This Quarter**

- The service projects and LifeSouth bloodmobile confirmed for the 7th annual Martin Luther King Day of Service. The Souper Bowl of Caring food drive began December 1 at Holiday Lights and will run through January 16, 2023. - · The invasive plant removal completed, and planting list confirmed, for Two Bridges Park.

#### **Projects Started This Quarter**

- The department filmed a Dunwoody Police Department recruitment video this quarter.
- · All drivers are participating in an in-person defensive driving class.
- Berry Dunn conducted two rounds of interviews and ride-along with Officers, Council members, and others as part of their review of the department, as well as a community listening meeting.

#### Finished Projects This Quarter

- The department received an Aftermath K9 grant of \$250.
- The department conducted three distracted driving details and issued 97 citations.
- The department participated in the National Prescription Take
   Back Initiative and collected a large number of prescription drugs.
- Officers transitioned to the new Glock 17 handguns equipped with advanced optics.
- More than 50 needy children were served through the Christmas for Kids program.
- The department served on a Sex Trafficking panel held at Dunwoody United Methodist Church.
- Sergeant Herbers and Sergeant Leach were promoted.
- The department participated in the See and Be Seen Campaign and the Truck or Treat event.
- The department participated in the Cops on Donut Shops event, raising \$5,000 for the athletes of Special Olympics Georgia.
- · The new Flock License Plate Reader cameras were deployed.
- Conducted a Death by Overdose free community class to Dunwoody citizens on October 12.
- Participated in DeKalb FOP's Santa Cop Bowling Tournament, helping to raise funds for DeKalb children in need.
- Participated in I Care Atlanta's Thanksgiving Outreach event, providing nearly 60 meals to Dunwoody families in need.



#### **Projects Started This Quarter**

- The construction has started on hotel, parking deck, and associated site work at the Campus 244 development. The work on the existing office building and addition is continuing.
- The Department has started the "Green Speak" lecture series focused on sustainability items. The first event was held at the Dunwoody Nature Center on November 7.
- The Department has submitted a grant application for a pedestrian connection between two residential streets.

#### **Ongoing Projects This Quarter**

- The Trail Master Plan is proceeding. An open house took place in December that had 98 members of the public in attendance and provided insight into public preferences.
- Grubb Properties has submitted a rezoning and special land use permit application to add a nursing home to its properties on Perimeter Center East. The application is expected for review by the City Council in February.
- The construction on the remaining parcels of Perimeter Marketplace is continuing. The QuikTrip gas station and the retail building will be completed in February.
- The construction at High Street is progressing with both residential buildings topped out. The phased opening will begin in 2024.
- The Code Enforcement division has conducted two apartment sweeps and is continuing to oversee the implementation of fixes.
- The Community Development department is continuing to support the Economic Development department with the Edge City 2.0 project.

#### **Finished Projects This Quarter**

- The Planning and Zoning Division, in partnership with the Police and Finance Departments, has introduced ideas for changes to the City's alcohol licensing requirements to facilitate experiential retail providers.
- The Department has submitted a successful application and has been granted "Tree City" for the 10th year in a row.
- The department successfully planned and administered the 2022 household electronic waste recycling event and served 310 residents.
