

PARKS & RECREATION



Projects Started This Quarter

- Planters constructed and sunflowers planted for Environment Program of Dunwoody Woman's Club 'Sunflower Project.'
 Interested parties include Dunwoody Garden Club, Dunwoody Nature Center, Spalding Garden Club, Dunwoody Cultural Arts Center partners, and Dunwoody Preservation Trust.
- Holiday Lights theme sent to Chitwood Studios for pricing and specs. Creative proposal due back to Rachel Waldron by end of July for August approval at Council Meeting. Display will open December 1 and run through the end of the year.

Ongoing Projects This Quarter

- Construction documents for the Dunwoody Veterans Memorial are complete and bids for construction have been received.
 A Vietnam War Memorial will also be built in addition to the existing Veterans Memorial at Brook Run Park. Concept drawings are still being reviewed and revised.
- New programs sourced for Fall/Winter '23, to include Little Medical School, a basketball partnership with First Baptist Church, and fundraiser with Peachtree Charter Middle School.

Finished Projects This Quarter

- Two Bridges Park completed, and Grand Opening held. Park is seeing lots of traffic, especially at the city's first splash pad.
- Park property at 5435 Roberts Drive named Wildcat Park at June 12 Council Meeting. Master Plan for the park includes amenities such as public art, nature trail, wildflower meadow and more.



The Dunwoody Preservation Trust unveiled a 19' diorama depicting the history of Dunwoody from 8,000 BC to present day. The relief sculpture is open to the public and on display at the Donaldson-Bannister Farm.



POLICE



Projects Started This Quarter

· Started the implementation of Power DMS Police Training Officer (PTO) module.

Finished Projects This Quarter

- The department paid for a Recruitment Billboard on I-285 near Lake Hearn in both directions. The digital billboard will be up for one month.
- · Members of the department participated in the Peachtree Middle School Career Day for 2023.
- · Members of the department conducted semi-annual Firearms Qualification training during May.
- In April, the department participated in the National Prescription Drug Take Back initiative collecting over 200 lbs. of prescription drugs for disposal.
- The department conducted several distracted driving details this quarter, issuing 96 citations, including 64 citations for hands-free violations. Multiple arrests were made, and two kilos of cocaine were seized.
- · Officers participated in the 10th Annual Ashford Chase Wiffle Ball Tournament, winning first place. Over \$3,000 was donated to the Dunwoody Police Foundation.
- · Officer Irwin displayed his vehicle and K-9 Ranger at the Remember the Fallen Veterans Car Show.
- The department participated in the Governor's Office of Highway Safety Click-It or Ticket Campaign.
 Dunwoody Police Officers, plus department's partners, issued 87 citations, including 60 citations for hands-free violations and 10 seatbelt violations.
- Officers participated in the Cops on Donut Shops event at Dunkin Donuts on Mt. Vernon, raising funds for the athletes of Special Olympics Georgia. The generous citizens of Dunwoody donated \$5,000.
- · The department restarted our Co-Responder program in partnership with the DeKalb County CSB.
- The department conducted three Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) training classes with 148 attendees.
- · The department completed implementing Carfax for Police for our investigators.
- The department negotiated a no-cost implementation of Flock OS as the backbone of our crimefighting efforts.
- · Detective Robert Barrett and Officer Jared Bradley were both promoted to Sergeant.
- The department held its 3rd Annual Teen Police Academy, and fifteen teens successfully completed the program.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Projects Started This Quarter


- The work on the Road Safety Action Plan has started. A draft version of the report is expected in late summer.
- The Planning & Zoning Division has drafted an ordinance to allow medical cannabis dispensaries to operate in Dunwoody. The final adoption by the City Council is expected in August.
- The Community Development department has started accepting applications for the second round of the front yard tree program.

Ongoing Projects This Quarter

- The city has received a \$100,000 grant award for the construction of a small bike/ pedestrian connection between Eidson Road and Cherry Hill Lane. The Community Development department will formally accept the grant before moving into the design phase.
- The construction at High Street is progressing with all buildings topped out and phased opening will likely start in Q4 of 2023.
- The construction is progressing at the Campus 244 development. The work on the future Element hotel has begun, and on-going work on the parking deck, and office building.
- The Marcus Jewish Community Center has completed its special land use permit application and has submitted a permit application for its campus improvements.

Finished Projects This Quarter

- The Department has submitted the renewal for the Atlanta Regional Commission Green Communities certification. The results are expected in late summer.
- The Planning & Zoning Division has coordinated several text amendments that implement changes in state law and regional requirements, tighten parking requirements for home occupations, and update standards for non-conforming uses.
 These were adopted by the City Council.
- The Trail Master Plan work has been completed. The City Council adopted the plan drafted by the PATH Foundation in May.



Finance



Projects Started This Quarter

- · The Finance department continues working on the FY2022 end of the year audit. The external auditors began audit fieldwork on Monday, March 20.
- · The department began conducting interviews for the vacant Assistant Finance Director position.
- · The staff is working on updating Standard Operating Procedures as needed with new software and processes moving forward.

Ongoing Projects and Projects Finished This Quarter

- · Finance completed the 2023 Operating and Capital Budget Book and applied to GFOA for the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award.
- Finance completed the Q4 2022 Project and Expenditure Report due to the Treasury Department related to ARPA funding. The report was due by January 31, 2023.
- The Georgia Crime Information Center (GCIC) conducts a pre-audit and an on-site audit at a minimum of once every two years to assess the City's Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) to ensure compliance with applicable statutes, regulations, and policies. Finance staff completed the pre-audit, and the on-site audit was conducted on Tuesday, March 14. Finance staff received confirmation that the city passed the audit.
- The Finance department distributed American Rescue Plan Funding to seven Non-Profits. Additionally, all Q1 2023 reporting has been completed, and three audits were conducted.
- The Finance department filed 8 insurance claims during the first quarter of 2023.
- The Audit Committee meeting was held on Monday, February 13.
- · The department presented the FY2022 Budget Amendments at the February 13 City Council meeting.
- · The Georgia Power Franchise Fee for FY2022 was collected and deposited into the City's bank account.
- The Q1 2023 Safety Committee Meeting was held.
- A meeting was held on Friday, March 24 to review the FY2023 Property and Liability Insurance renewal with GIRMA. The city will see an approximately 10% increase in the premiums, similar to what other participating municipalities experienced.
