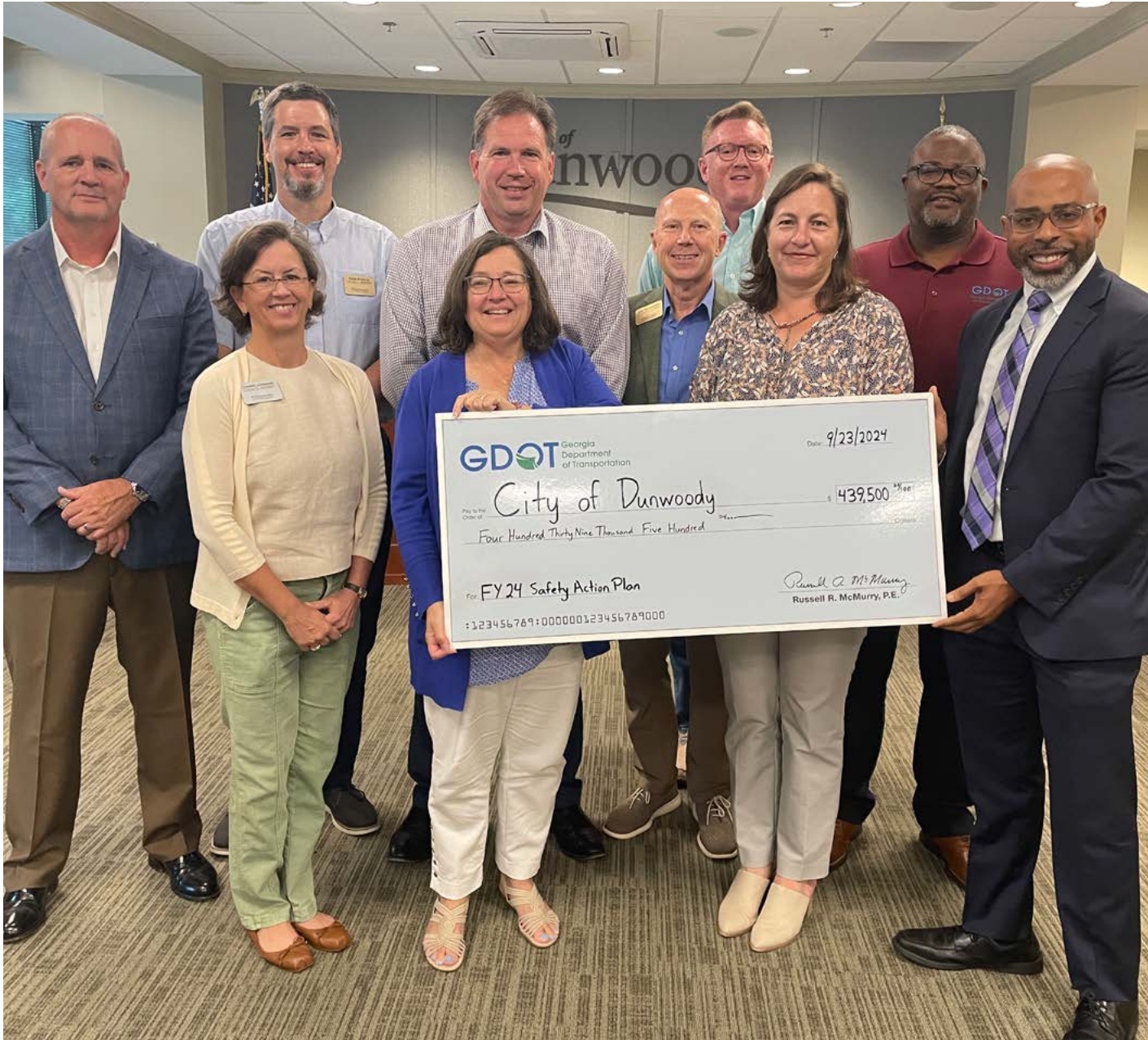

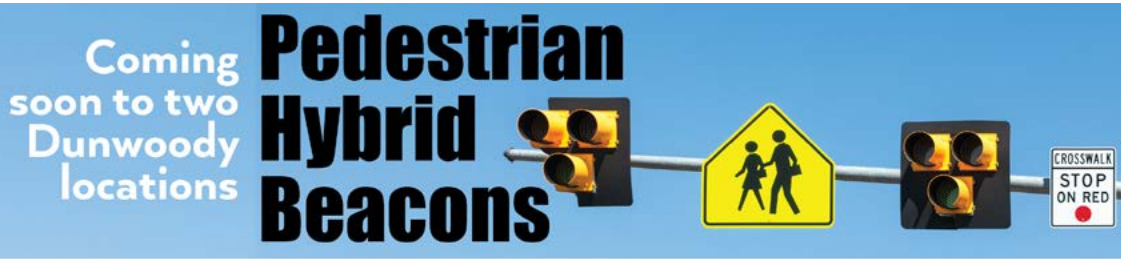

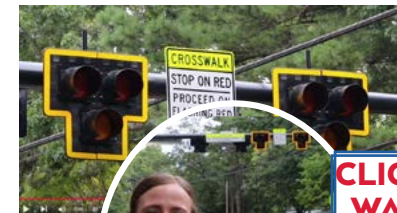

- Shade structure construction at Two Bridges Park began in September. Structures will provide ample shade for both the playground and splash pad amenities.
- Parks logo art sculpture for Two Bridges Park approved by Dunwoody Arts Commission. Sculpture is designed by Huelani Mei Fogleman, the creative force behind Grounded Growth and Grounded Gathering at Brook Run Park. Installation slated for November 2024.
- Color scheme selected for Waterford Park playground by neighborhood residents. Notice to Proceed awarded to Bliss Products for playground completion by end of 2024.
- Review of agreements renewing for 2025, including Treetop Quest and seven athletic Agreements.
- Playground surfacing roll coat completed at Windwood Hollow Park, Georgetown Park, and Pernoshal Park. Brook Run Park roll coat to begin end of October.
- Vietnam War Memorial ribbon-cutting and dedicated ceremony held on October 5.
- Monument signs for Brook Run Park, Wildcat Park, Homecoming Park, Donaldson-Bannister Farm, Waterford Park, and Dunwoody Nature Center are complete.

DPD's 15th
Citizens Police
Academy

Highlights

- Citizens' Police Academy began its 15th course. Weekly classes through October 29. Graduates to be recognized at the November 12 Council meeting.
- DPD's first Public Safety Assistance Canine (PSAC) was purchased, courtesy of Dunwoody Police Foundation funding. The PSAC is currently undergoing training; along with her selected Handler, Detective and Peer Support Specialist Eric Haviland.
- DPD's first 2 Public Safety Ambassadors (PSA's) were hired. Interviews continue to fill the last 2 positions.
- Free community events and classes were offered, such as Child Safety Seat Checks, Active Shooter Response, Teen Police Academy, Let's Taco Bout It, and National Night Out.
- Three new officer recruits were hired during the third quarter.
- The operational security plan for the 4th of July parade was successful; no incidents to note.
- Officers participated in the Dunwoody Pines Ice Cream Social event.
- Deputy Chief Fladrich, Major Krieg, Lt. Fecht and Sgt. Carley were recognized during a promotional ceremony.
- Each officer has been equipped with a LifeVac rescue suction device, courtesy of Dunwoody Police Foundation funding.

Accolades and Happenings

- Unveiling of the new Billy J. Grogan Real Time Crime Center (RTCC). The RTCC is now fully operational.
- During Hurricane Helene, the newly acquired RTCC proved to be an invaluable tool as technicians were able to monitor safety conditions throughout the City and field a solid emergency response in conjunction with Public Works staff.
- Heavy recruitment continues with a fresh campaign announcing increased starting pay and hiring bonus.

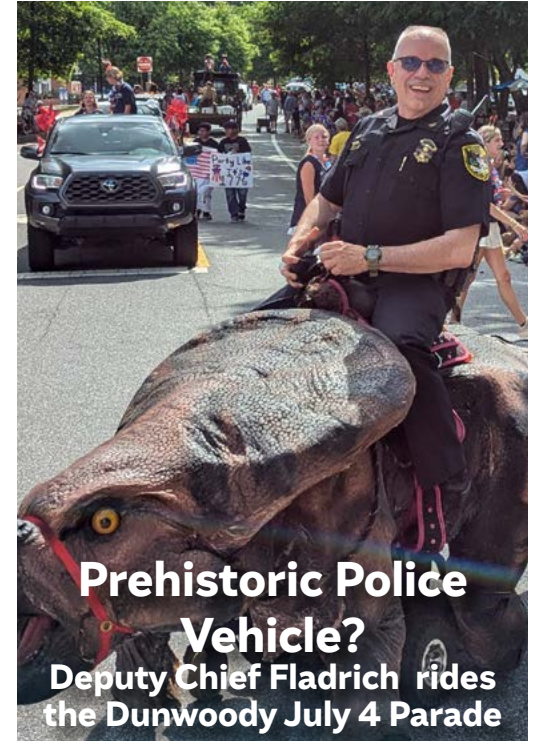

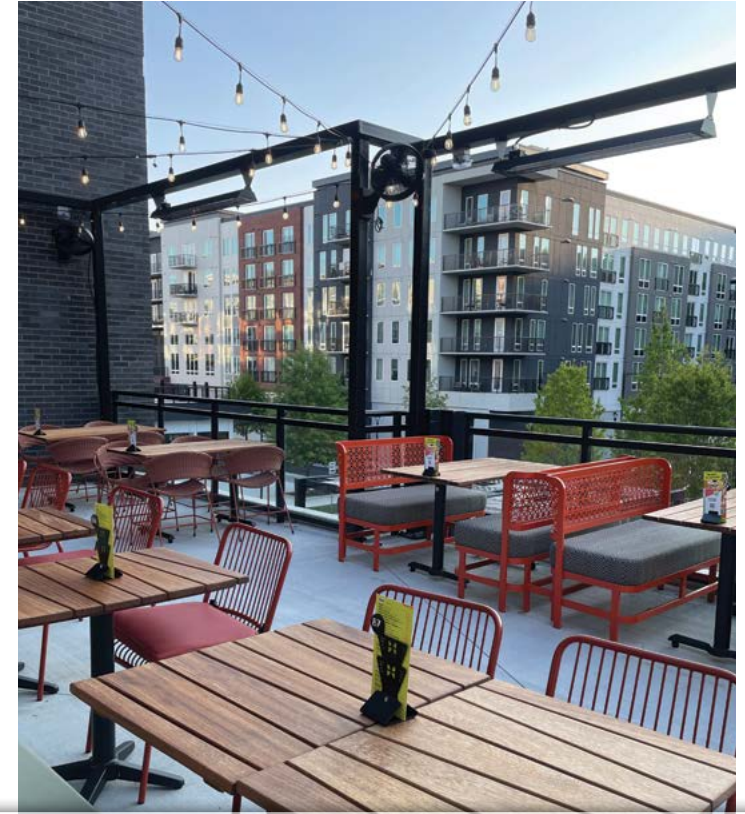


Highlights

- The new Georgetown storage facility permits were issued. Construction is expected to start soon.
- The Department started work on zoning cases for a new Starbucks on Perimeter Center West and for the shopping center at Jett Ferry and Mount Veron Roads.
- Work on building out the new permitting software continues
- Work on the Direction Dunwoody project is continuing. The first survey had over 1,000 responses, a pop-up session was held in the Dunwoody Village Courtyard on August 9th, and a community workshop with 60 attendees was held in Perimeter in September.
- Additional High Street stores are finalizing their build-out in Q3 of 2024, including Jaguar Bolera and Puttshack.
- Payroc, the new payment vendor for the iWorQ permitting software was on boarded, which will allow credit card and ACH payments.
- City Council adopted new rules for community residences and recovery communities.
- New permitting fees for projects valued under \$75,000 was adopted in compliance with state laws.
- High Street opened to the public and all buildings received their Certificate of Occupancy. Opened stores include Nando's, Velvet Taco, and Ben & Jerry's.
- City Council adopted a text amendment for streetscapes for the Jett Ferry area.

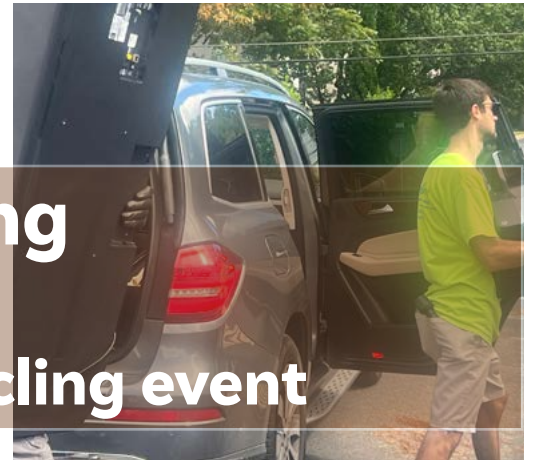
- The department has issued permits for the new Georgetown storage facility. Construction is expected to start within weeks.
