

Rules/Regulations for Temporary Signage

- 1. Temporary banners shall not exceed 36 square feet each.
- 2. Each temporary banner must be individually attached to poles, mast arms, fences, building facade or other similar structures.
- 3. No more than two temporary banners shall be displayed on any lot at one time. If attached to the building, then 1 per tenant suite with exterior pedestrian entrance; if attached to a fence, freestanding or retaining wall or ground mounted, then one per property or up to two per common development.
- 4. All temporary signs must be maintained in good condition as provided for flags in section 20-66.
- 5. No temporary banner shall be displayed for more than 14 consecutive days, with no more than six such 14- day periods being permitted per calendar year per lot.
- 6. Pole banners are regulated by section 26-279 and are not subject to the standards of this chapter.
- 7. Small yard signs do not require a permit but must comply with the regulations of the code. Small yard signs shall not exceed 6 square feet each and cannot be more than 3 feet high. Residential districts can have a maximum of 5 small yard signs per lot. All other districts can have 1 small yard sign per lot or 1 small yard sign per tenant suite, depending on which is applicable.
- 8. Large yard signs, which cannot exceed 12 square feet and cannot be more than 6 feet high, require a permit and are not allowed in single-family residential districts.
- 9. Temporary banners for new businesses for 60 days prior to the installation of a permanent sign do not require a permit but must follow the temporary banner regulations.
- 10. One entrance wall banner, which cannot exceed 30 square feet, is permitted at the entrance of a common development for a total of 2 months per calendar year. There are no other temporary banners permitted in residential districts.

The City of Dunwoody's Code Enforcement conducts sign sweeps periodically in order to determine compliance with temporary signs. Fines for signs out of compliance can be up to \$1,000.
